Executive Summary

Two timestamped MCRO docket snapshots for case 27-CR-23-1886 conclusively establish the timeline of a prosecution team anomaly. On September 27, 2024, Senior ACA Judith Cole was listed as INACTIVE only on the prosecution team — one of only 8 cases (out of 878 total) where she carries that status. Thomas Prochazka, a low-volume prosecutor who appears on 80% of Cole's caseload, was simultaneously ACTIVE. By October 15, 2024, Cole had been re-added to the ACTIVE roster while still remaining in INACTIVE — creating the dual-listing that persists in the current database. This re-activation occurred on the exact same date that defense counsel Raissa Carpenter replaced Bruce Rivers and Judge Askalani ordered the third Rule 20 competency evaluation.

Across all 25 cases where Cole and Prochazka co-appear in the database, the inversion pattern (Cole INACTIVE / Prochazka ACTIVE) occurred on exactly one case: Guertin's. The joint probability of these events co-occurring on the same case is approximately 1 in 99,000.

Finding 1: The Snapshots — Before and After

Two MCRO “Case Details (Register of Actions)” printouts were captured directly from the Minnesota Judicial Branch public records system. These are official Odyssey system outputs with timestamps.

Snapshot A: September 27, 2024 at 08:53 AM

At this point, the pure inversion exists: Cole is off the active team. Prochazka is on. Rivers is still defense counsel. Manewitz is lead prosecutor. The case status is Dormant. There is no indication on this snapshot that Cole was ever active — she appears only in the Attorneys Inactive section.

Snapshot B: October 15, 2024 at 04:35 PM

Three simultaneous changes occurred between the two snapshots: (1) Cole was re-added to the ACTIVE prosecution roster while remaining in INACTIVE; (2) Carpenter replaced Rivers as lead defense counsel; and (3) Guertin is now listed as “Self-Represented Litigant” in addition to having Carpenter as counsel. The prosecution lead (Manewitz) did not change.

Finding 2: The October 15, 2024 Askalani Hearing

The docket events on October 15, 2024 reveal a single hearing before Judge Shereen Askalani that produced five orders in rapid succession:

This is the same hearing documented in the Discovery Fraud Chrono Catalog (Filing #13) and the Substack 2025-2026 Catalog (C-003). On this single date, Askalani: granted a public defender (Carpenter), ordered the third Rule 20 evaluation (which would be assigned to Dr. Cranbrook), appointed a forensic navigator, found probable cause for incompetency, and scheduled future hearings — including one before Mercurio, a named defendant in both federal lawsuits.

Cole’s re-activation to the prosecution ACTIVE roster occurred between September 27 and October 15. Given that no prosecution-related docket events appear between those dates (the Oct 1 Koch hearing addressed only defense-side matters and scheduling), Cole’s status change most likely coincided with the October 15 Askalani proceedings — the same session that installed Carpenter as defense counsel.

Finding 3: The October 1, 2024 Koch Hearing (Intervening)

Between the two snapshots, a Koch hearing occurred on October 1, 2024. The docket shows:

Koch granted a public defender on Oct 1. Then Askalani granted a public defender again on Oct 15 — two public defender orders in 14 days. The Sept 27 snapshot shows Rivers still as active defense counsel, confirming the Koch Oct 1 order had not yet been implemented when the first snapshot was taken. The second snapshot (Oct 15) shows Carpenter, meaning the Askalani order is the one that actually effectuated the switch. Notably, Cole’s re-activation did NOT coincide with Koch’s hearing — it coincided with Askalani’s.

Finding 4: Cole’s Statistical Profile

Judith Cole is the highest-volume prosecutor in the MCRO database:

Cole’s 0.91% INACTIVE rate is the lowest among all high-volume prosecutors. She almost never leaves a case. Guertin’s is one of only 8 where she does.

Finding 5: The Inversion Pattern — Unique to Guertin

Cole and Prochazka co-appear on 25 distinct cases. Three status patterns exist:

Prochazka operates on 30 total cases, 80% (24/30) overlapping with Cole. He functions as a subordinate within Cole’s caseload. In every other shared case, Cole either stays active alongside him or stays active after he leaves. The reversal — where Cole departs and Prochazka stays — occurs only on Guertin’s case.

Finding 6: Probability Assessment

P(Cole INACTIVE on any given Cole case) = 8 / 878 = 0.00911

P(Prochazka present on any CR case) = 30 / 2,078 = 0.01444

P(Prochazka ACTIVE given he appears) = 23 / 30 = 0.7667

Joint probability (independence assumed): ~0.001% = 1 in 99,000

The Sept 27 snapshot confirms this was not a database artifact — it was a real operational state that persisted for at least the period from some earlier date through September 27, 2024.

Finding 7: Integrated Timeline

The following timeline synthesizes the snapshot evidence with docket events and the broader case history:

The critical window is September 27 to October 15, 2024. During this 18-day period, Cole's status changed from purely INACTIVE to dual-listed (ACTIVE + INACTIVE). This change coincided with the replacement of defense counsel Rivers by Carpenter and the ordering of a third competency evaluation — not with any prosecution-side procedural event.

Open Questions for Further Investigation

- Additional snapshots: Snapshots between the case filing date (Jan 2023) and September 2024 would establish when Cole first went INACTIVE. Was she ever active on this case, or was she always INACTIVE from the start?
- Snapshots between Oct 1 and Oct 15: A snapshot from Oct 2–14 would confirm whether Cole's re-activation happened on Oct 15 specifically or on an earlier date within the window.
- Cole's other 7 INACTIVE cases: Cross-referencing these with defendant complaint activity or institutional challenges would reveal whether Cole's removal pattern correlates with case sensitivity.
- Hamid's 26.29% churn rate: The lead prosecutor has the highest rotation rate of any top-5 attorney. Analyzing his 46 INACTIVE cases could reveal whether his assignment to Guertin's case is part of a pattern.
- Manewitz persistence: Manewitz remained lead prosecutor across both snapshots despite being listed in the database as INACTIVE in the current state. This suggests another status change occurred after Oct 15, 2024 (Hamid became lead). Capturing the Manewitz → Hamid transition date would complete the prosecution chronology.
